ON OCTOBER 15, 2011, **The Brewster Trust** launched a new project, the **Goal Campaign 2011**, following its mission statement to promote, develop and improve football in Barbados and to create opportunities – especially for the youth.

The central question asked in this campaign is: "Would two new portable football goals with nets be of use to you?"

The registered Barbadian charity invites clubs, teams, schools, communities or families to apply for football goals which are available in four different sizes. The best applications will be awarded two brand new portable football goals with nets subject to a few simple conditions.

The countdown is on – deadline is November 13. Less than two weeks are left to send in an application via web portal, email, letter or fax.

"The feedbacks we got so far are overwhelming; it is an interesting mixture of families, primary schools, communities, football clubs, teams and academies, social clubs and also organisations linked to Government or church," states Axel Bernhardt, chief executive officer of **The Brewster Trust**.

"Of course we still invite everybody to participate so that we are able to improve the football infrastructure in Barbados as focused as possible," he adds.

Approximately 200 footballers are currently involved in the programme **Football Autumn 2011**, a mobile coaching initiative with spots St Thomas, St Philip, St Lucy, St James and St Michael taking place between September and December 2011.

The programme is open for everyone, free of charge and planned for children aged five to 14 years. The two-hour coaching sessions during the week are followed by festivals and tournaments on Saturdays and dedicated goalkeeper coaching every Sunday.
