Coca Cola Under-19 football kicks off today

THE 2012 COCA COLA Barbados Secondary Schools' Football League will get off the ground today at several venues across the island.

Defending champions Samuel Jackman Prescod Polytechnic will be heading Zone B along with fellow finalist Alexandra. Also in that zone are Coleridge & Parry, Combermere School, Deighton Griffith, Ellerslie, Grantley Adams Memorial, The Lester Vaughan School, St James Secondary and St Lucy Secondary.

Perennial champions Pine Hill St Leonard's will be heading Zone A along with one of the favourites for this year's competition, the Barbados Community College.

Looking to upstage them in that zone will be Alleyne School, Foundation School, Harrison College, Princess Margaret, Queen's College, The St Michael School, The Lodge School and Trident Splash Parkinson.

A new committee is in place to run the league under president Adrian Mapp, a physical education teacher at The Lester Vaughan School.

His vice-president is Rory Sidaway, while Don R. Small and Christopher Oliver were returned as secretary and treasurer respectively. The assistant secretary is Tamisha Marshall; Michael Cummins, the public relations officer and the floor members are Ray Nicholls and Philip Moore.

The league has also met with officials at Sportsmax and are now part of a regional plan to have some of their matches broadcast on the network which will give them additional mileage and exposure of their footballers.

Under the initiative of the new president, the league will also be re-establishing their website and are soon to gain assistance from the Brewster's Trust in a number of areas.
