Dear colleagues,

It is with mixed feelings that I write this report. Firstly I am extremely happy that we have been able to implement our developmental programme but somewhat disappointed that all schools did not complete the requirements. For those schools that did, congratulations to you, and please make proper use of the equipment you received. For those who did not complete, I certainly hope that you know now that we are serious in our endeavours to help those member schools who participate fully in our programmes. That being said, I will ask all schools to continue to participate as we will be providing plenty opportunities to better our coaches and teams alike.

Our competitions were well received with the final of the Under-19 competition being the highlight at the final of the Lime Pelican Football Challenge at Kensington Oval. All competitions were completed with little to no defaulted games. A few teams still didn't look as uniformed as we hoped but this will be dealt with quite soon. I must take this opportunity though to congratulate our girls' teams as the participation is growing.

Schools: Lester Vaughan, Alexandra, Queen's College, Lodge, Harrison College, Princess Margaret, Alleyne, Ellerslie, Ch Ch Foundation, Springer, Frederick Smith and Deighton Griffith all have teams and are expected to participate in this year's competition. We would be happy if other schools get on board with this competition as the future of female football in Barbados depends heavily on the BSSFL.

This year we will be experimenting with a new format in the Under-16s and to a lesser extent the girls. The other two (2) competitions will remain very close to the previous format. We ask you indulgence as we seek to improve the standard of football in the BSSFL and by extension in Barbados overall.

I am please to say that the overall discipline while it can always be improved, is not a major cause of concern, as we have not had many incidents of concern or even showings of red cards. To this end I say to coaches continue to positively influence and discipline your players as this is the most vital part of the game itself.

To coaches, I plead with you to set examples for your players and insist on the standard that we need in our schools and also in our football. There must be no insulting of referees by coaches, students or parents, so again we must use our influence in this regard. We are promoting "respect in football" and expect that all persons involved will respect all players and adults. We must win and lose gracefully.

Please note that our competition rules will be strictly adhered to by all and our registration deadlines must be kept. Any playing of persons/students who are not eligible for the particular

THE BSSFL PROGRAMME 2013

Firstly a successful and enjoyable coaching course was held for three days in January this year. The course was facilitated by Mr. Adrian Mapp and Mr. Axel Bernhardt. It was run at the SJPP ground in the Pine by Mr. John Olaley from the Arsenal FC academy and was well attended by 40 male and female PE teachers/coaches from schools across the island. Coaches received notepads, a pair of Arsenal shorts, water bottle and a good lunch each day.



Also starting in January, The Brewster Trust organised assistance for Barbados Secondary Schools Football League members whereby coaches from the Arsenal in the Community programme visited schools on a weekly basis. This program lasted until July, taking in the second and third terms of the school year.





The schools had choices of "Curriculum Sessions", Double Club which includes an academic part combining general literacy and football, an after school programme or a community session on Saturday mornings. 21 schools registered for the weekly sessions.

In mid June the BSSFL, in conjunction with The Brewster Trust, UNICEF and the Child Care Board organised a seminar on Child Protection in Sport at the Lester Vaughan School. This event was also well attended and the participants received a lot of useful and informative literature.

Most recently, the FIFA World Cup viewing at the Hilton was opened to four pupils from 15 secondary schools. This gave students and coaches the opportunity to see and take photos with the FIFA World Cup.
