#### Rock star welcome for women's champs

World Cup triumph in Germany.

Unused to the fanfare the players filed quietly through the airport arrivals lobby in Tokyo, squinting as hundreds of excited fans snapped away with cameras.

"It hadn't sunk in that we'd won the World Cup until we landed at Narita airport," said captain Homare Sawa, the tournament's MVP and leading scorer.

"Id never seen so many people come to greet us.

It was amazing," added the talismanic leader of Japan's Nadeshiko named after a type of frilly pink carnation, symbolising grace and stoicism. Japan's heroes then faced a media crush of around 300 reporters, the World Cup, Sawa's MVP and Golden Ball and the Fair Play trophy gleaming in front of them. Winners of Asia's first world football title at any level, the occasion got to

world football title at any level, the occasion got to many of the players who had shocked the United States with a penalty shoot-out victory in Sunday's final.

Even Sawa, the scorer of 80 goals in 173 internationals, fluffed her lines, sitting down before being told and jumping to her feet, covering her mouth with her hands in embarrassment.

her feet, covering her mouth with her hands in embarrassment. "I heard at rumour there would be a lot of people but this is like an event for the men's team," said coach Norio Sasaki. "It's a new piece of history for the Nadeshiko." Showing few signs of fatigue after their dream run in Germany and long flight home, Sasaki and his players paid their respects to the victims of the deadly tsunami in March. "Hopfeilly we were able to give an emotional boost to the victims of disaster," he said. "But it doesn't stop here for us and we must qualify for next year's London Olympics first." (Reuters)

BARCELONA – Barcelona are ready to fight to bring Arsenal captain Cese Fabregas back to the club right up until the transfer deadline on August 31, oach Pep Guardiola said vesterday. Barça are in talks with Arsenal to buy the 24-year-old Spain midfielder, a long-term target for the Spanish and European champions, Guardiola, flanked by sporting director Andoni Zubizarreta, told a news conference.
